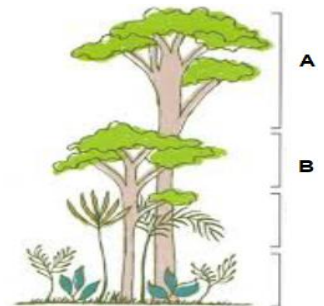

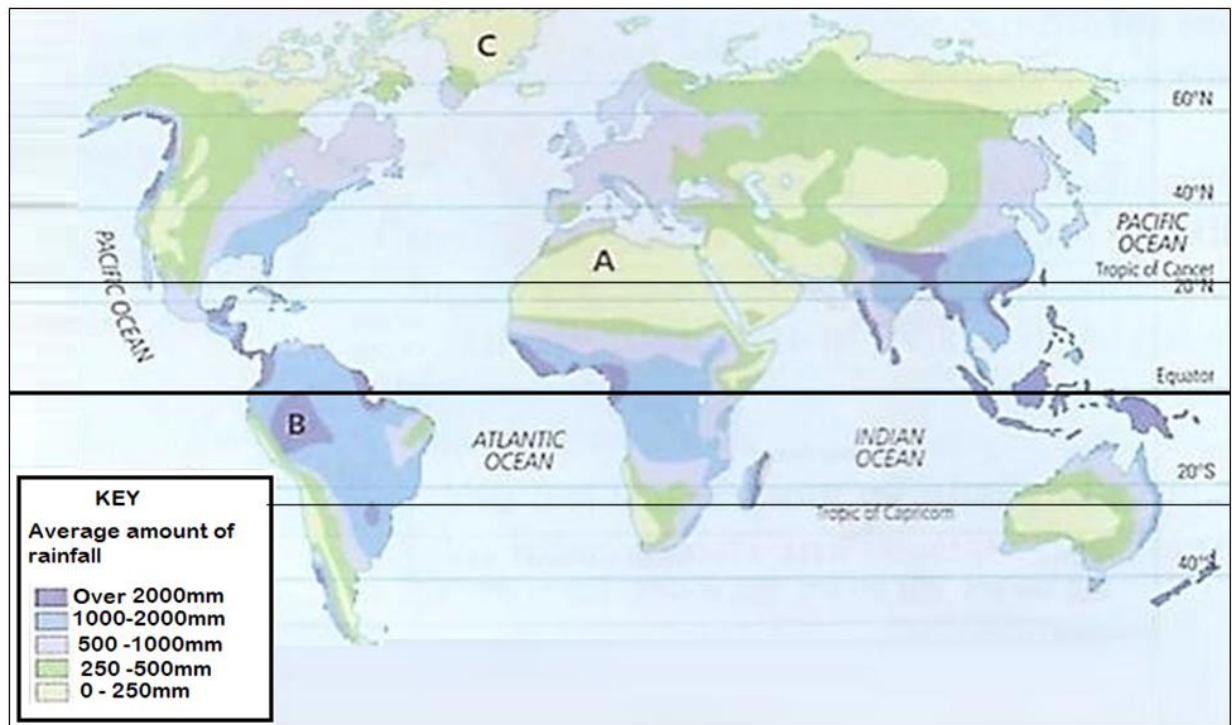

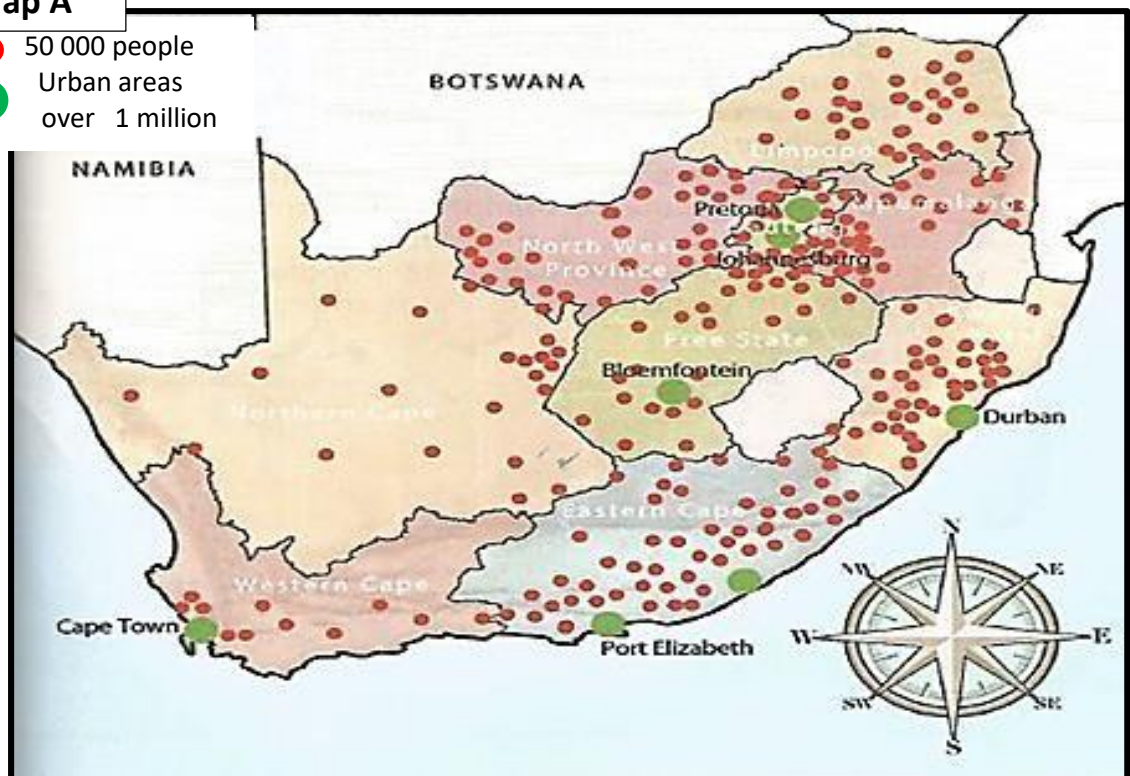

CASE STUDY OF A MAJOR CITY

New York is a beautiful city which is located in the north-eastern part of the United States of America. It has a large population and is known as a financial, cultural and manufacturing centre. It has also become a popular choice for foreign visitors.



New York is also the home of the famous Statue of Liberty which was given to New York by France to mark the centennial celebrations of the American Declaration of Independence.

This city is so different from other cities, is so busier, so much active and so much alive. It has the world's largest natural harbour. The shoreline around New York Harbour is very steep, and under-water it drops off and becomes deep very quickly. This makes an ideal harbour. This has helped the city grow in importance as a trading city. People and supplies can be easily ferried on the Hudson River.



New York has a humid subtropical climate. The people get much sunshine in summer. However, winters are cold and damp. Spring and autumn are unpredictable and can range from chilly to warm. Summers are typically hot and humid with a July average of 24,7°C.

Tropical cyclones and tropical storms are rare in the New York area, but are not unheard of and always have the potential to strike the area.
