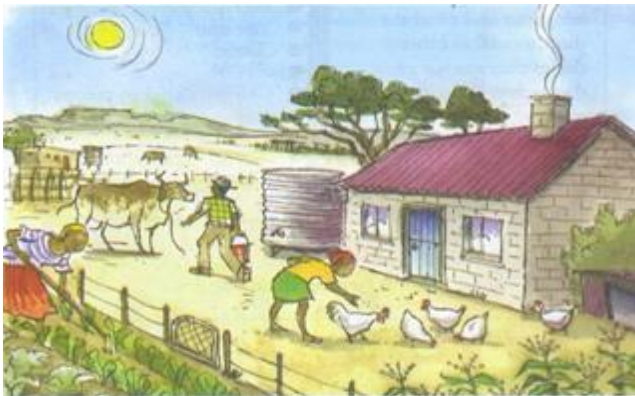

Mr Mati and his family own a plot of land in the Northern Cape that is one hectare in size. The family depends on their livestock and crops for food. They grow maize, vegetables and they keep five chickens and a cow. They used to



have five sheep, but sold them after last drought, as it is too expensive to buy feed for them when all the grazing died. Water for crops comes from the nearby river. They carry the water in buckets. Sometimes Mr Mati is able to sell eggs and milk to his neighbours. He uses money to buy food and clothes and pay school fees. He is saving to buy a new spade and some poles for fencing.



Mrs Ngwenya

Mrs Ngwenya and her family own farm in Limpopo province that is 50 hectares in size. They grow tobacco and maize that gets sold and exported. The business employs 20 workers. In the picking



season they employ another 10 workers. The farm has electricity and uses irrigation machinery to water the crops. Mrs Ngwenya uses some of the money she earns to buy more seed, fertilizer and equipment and to pay the workers and repair broken equipment. She uses the rest of her money to support her family. She is also saving so she can buy more land to farm fruit.

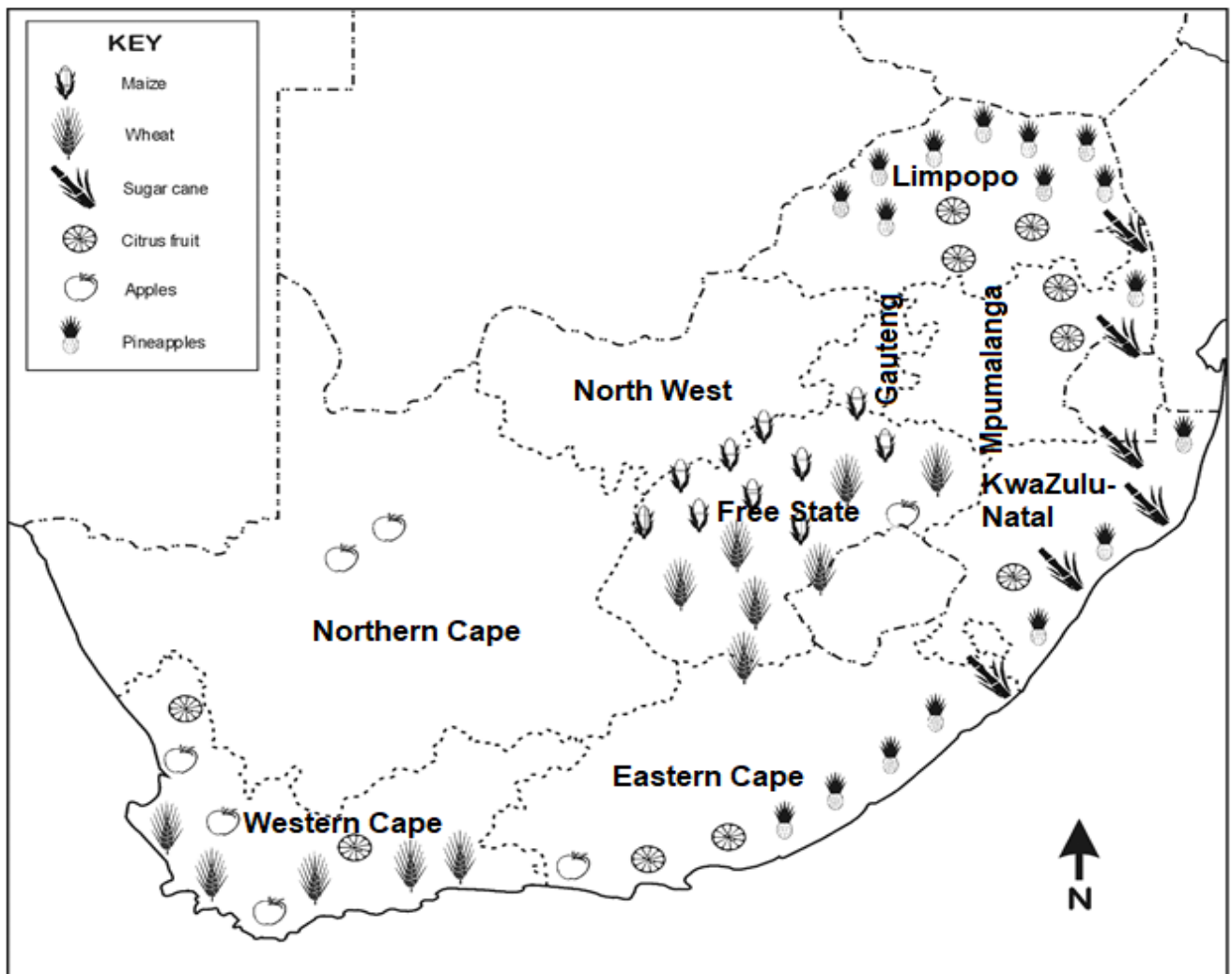

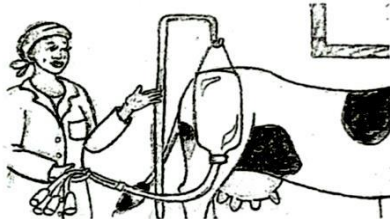

It is now eight o'clock and we have milked over 100 cows! We use machines like this to help us.

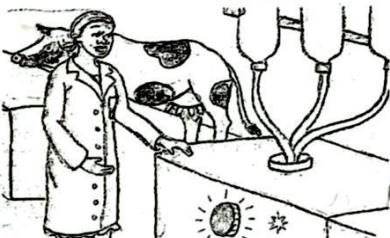
The cows eat food while we milk them. This keeps them standing still and helps them to produce more milk.



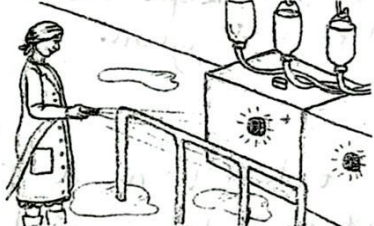
At 4 o'clock we milk the cows again. Then we clean the machines again and take the cows back to the fields for the night.

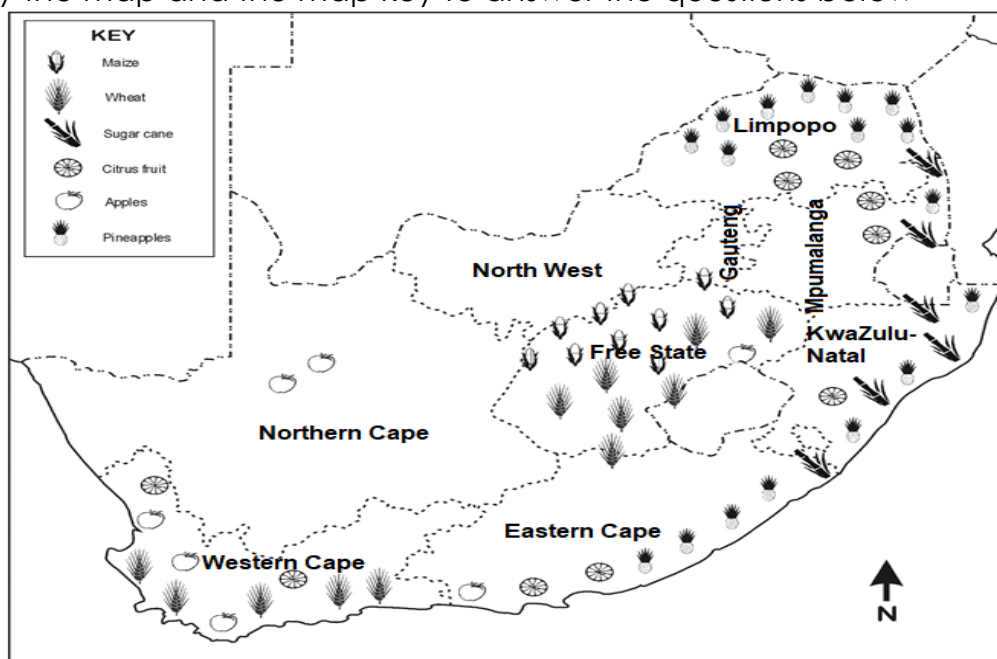
