The three little pigs



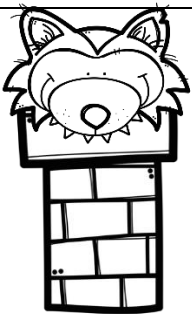
The third little pig build his house using bricks. The wolf couldn't blow it over. Then the wolf made a new plan.



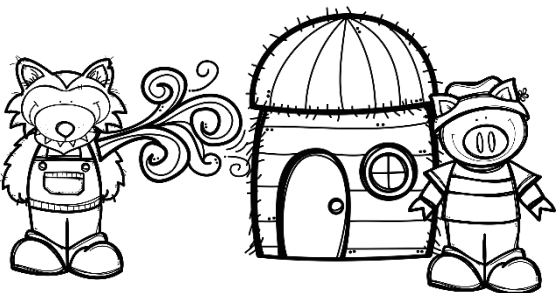
The second little pig build his house with wooden sticks. The wolf huffed and puffed and blew the house down.



Wolf fell into the pot with the warm water. As fast as he could, he jumped out and ran out the door. He never bothered the three little pigs again.



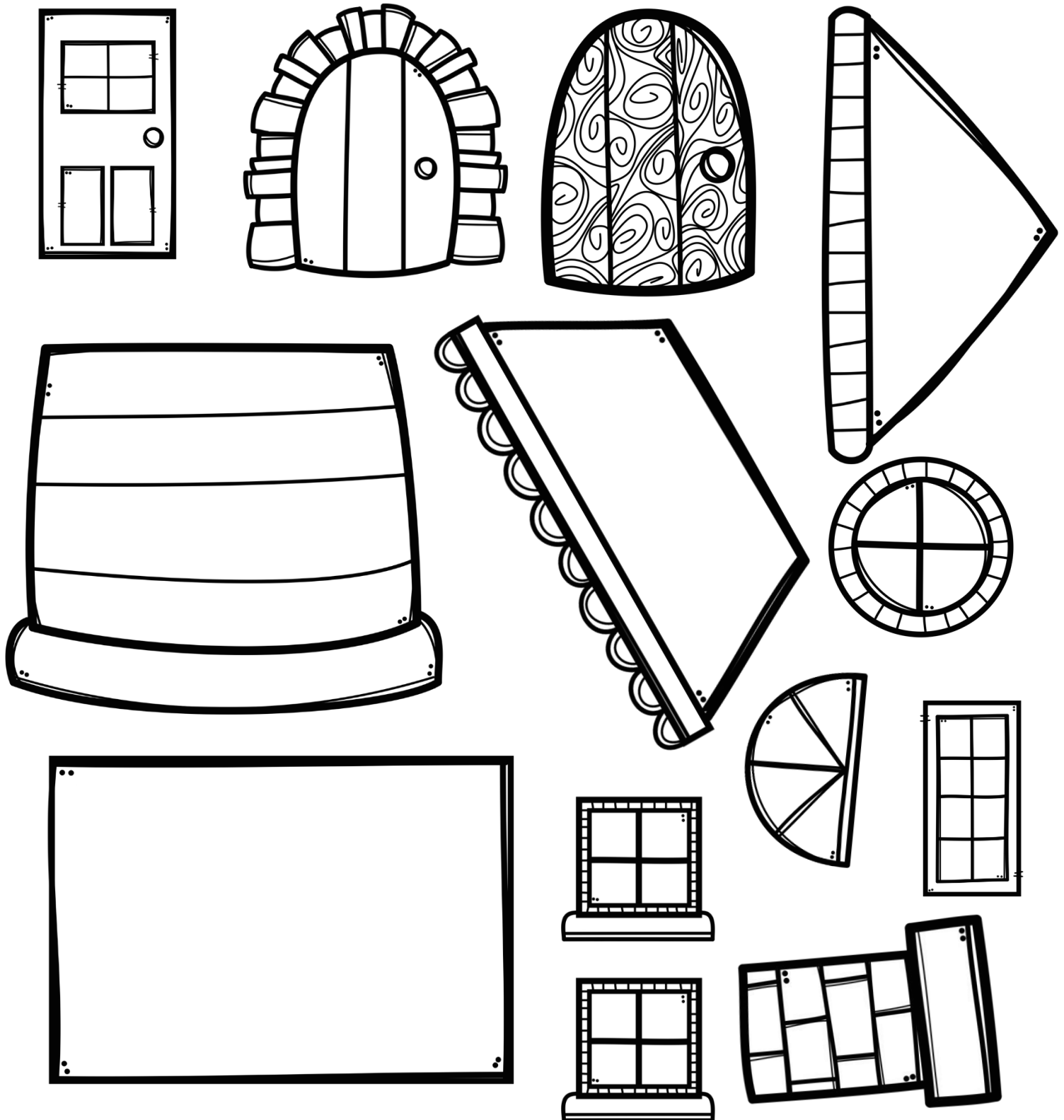
Wolf climbed down the chimney to surprise the three little pigs. But they knew he was coming and started to boil some water.



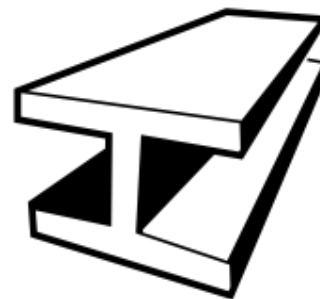
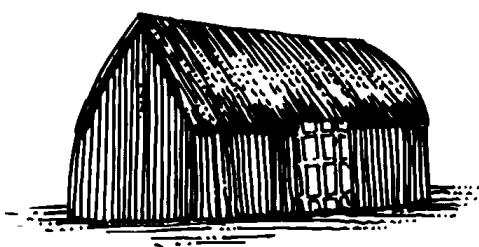
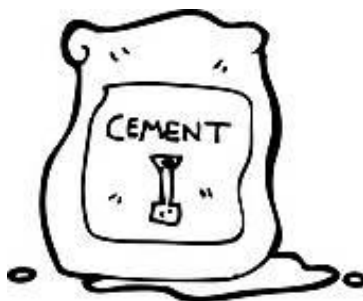
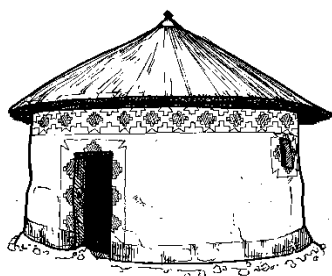
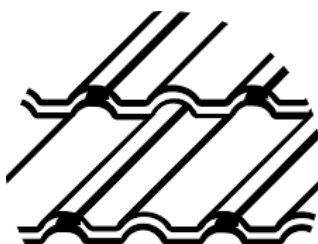
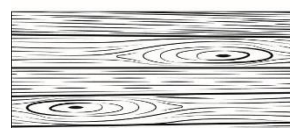
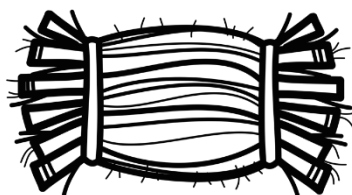
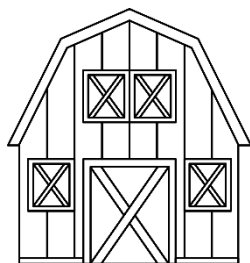
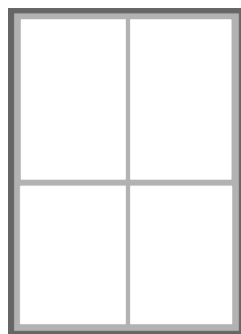
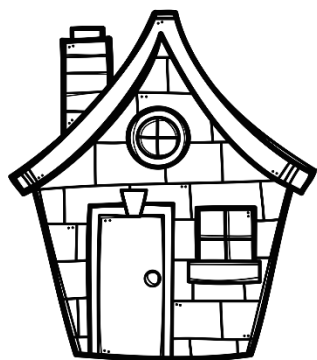

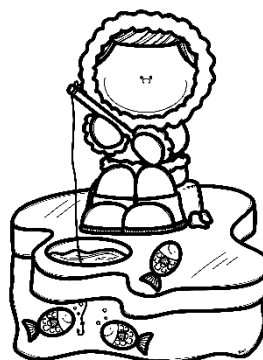
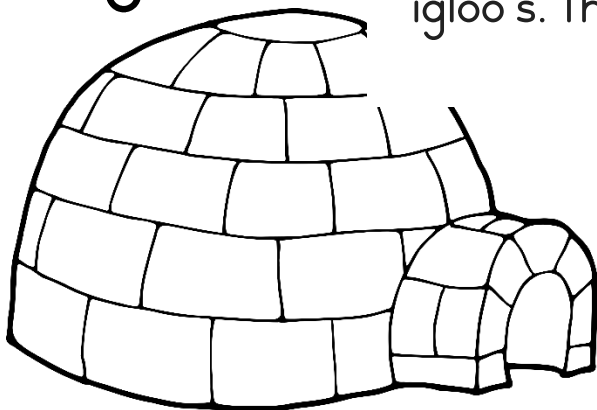
Houses for the different types of weather.

Houses keep us safe from different weather conditions. Houses protect us from the warm rays of the sun as well as against the cold, wind and rain.

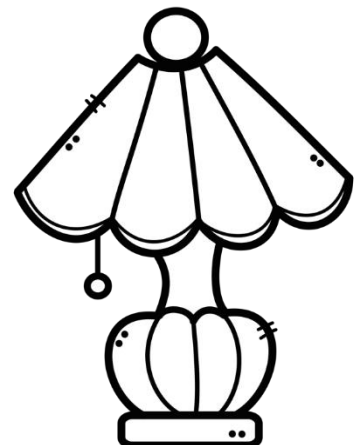
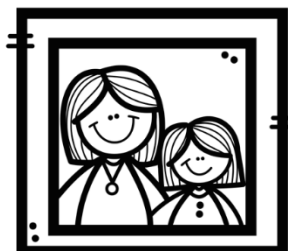
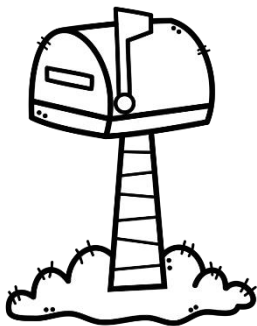
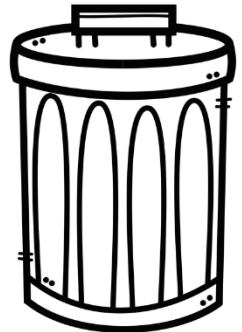
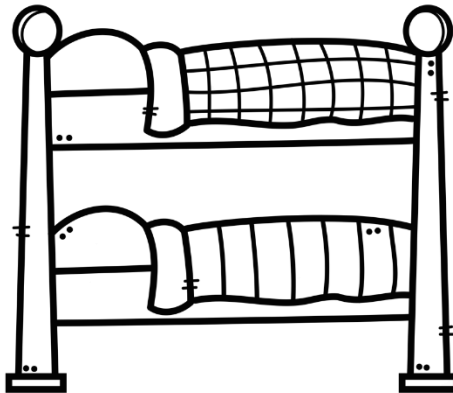
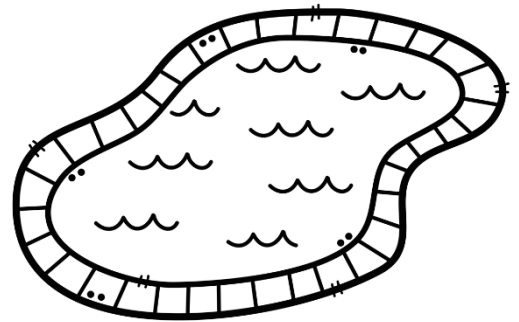
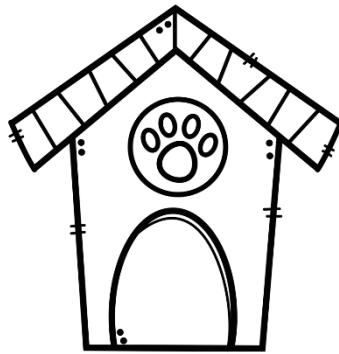
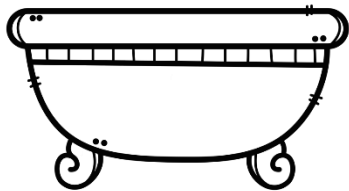
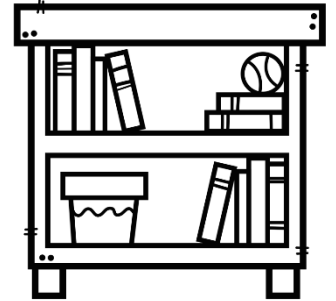
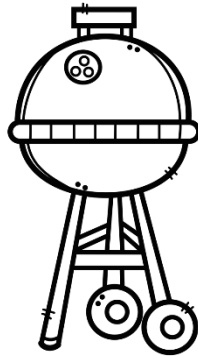
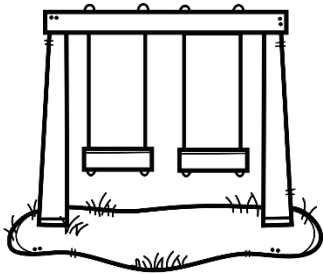


In many cold countries, people build their homes using snow and ice. We call these houses igloo's. The ice keeps out the cold.

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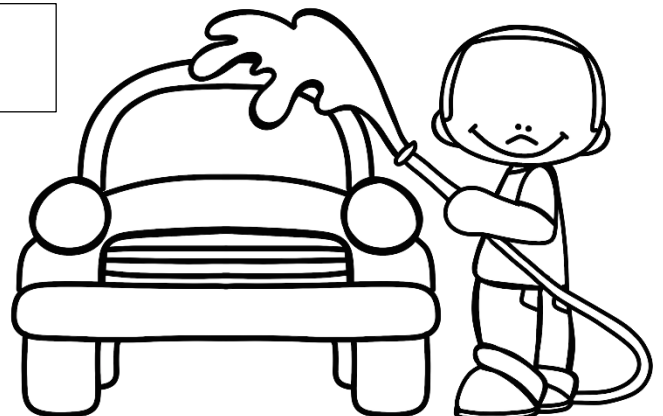
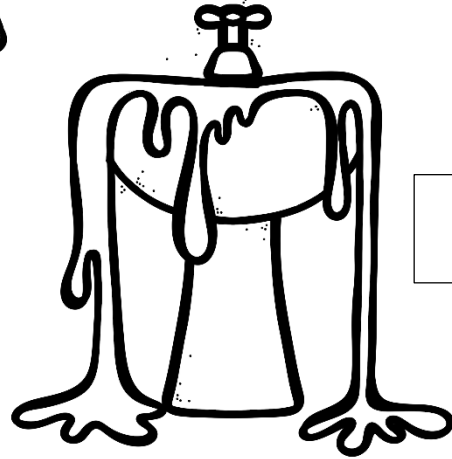
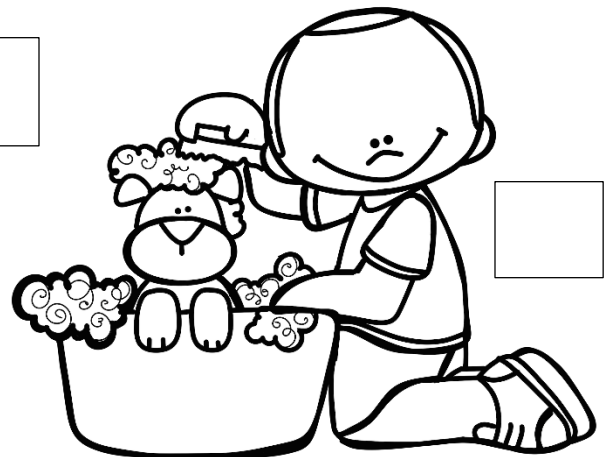
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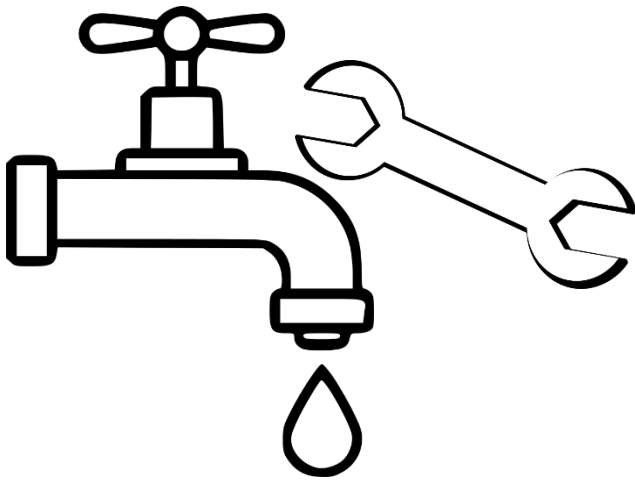
Save our water

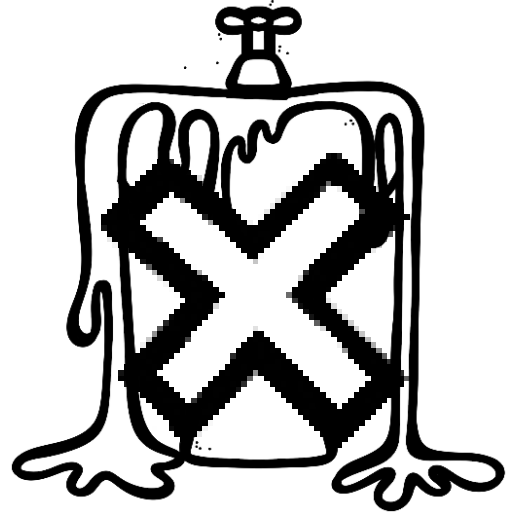

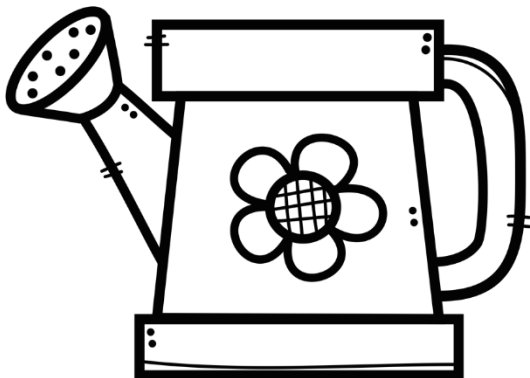
Do not let the water run while you are brushing your teeth.



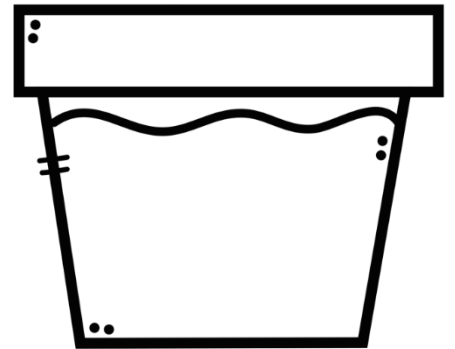
It does not take much time to fix a tap that is leaking, but it can save a lot of water and make a big difference.



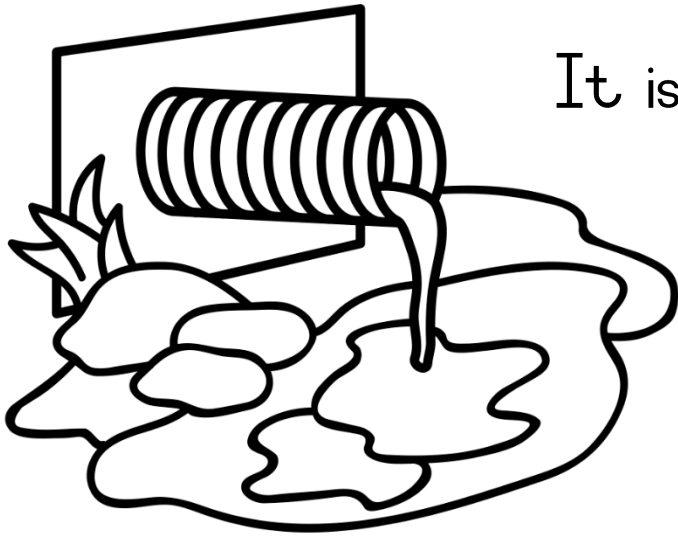
Reuse the bath water to wet the garden or flush the toilet.



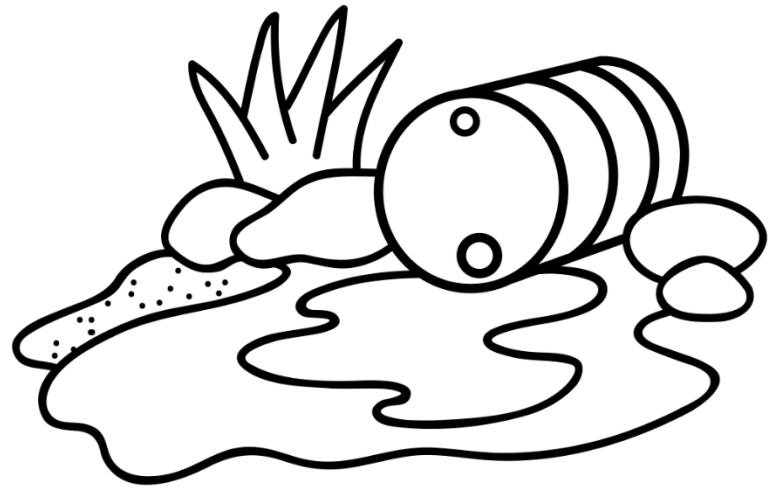
Use a watering can to wet the flowers. Do not use a hosepipe.

Sometimes we can see the moon in the sky during the day. The moon isn't very bright due to the rays of the sun.

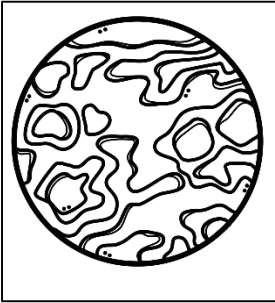
