GUIDELINES FOR SETTING THE JUNE AND NOVEMBER CONTROLLED TESTS

Dear Teacher

Included in this Test Booklet are various past question papers. These papers are meant to serve as a bank of questions that you may use to develop your own papers depending on how far you have come with content coverage. The papers may not be used as is since the structure of the exams has changed. Instead of an exam we now speak of a Controlled Test. Below are simple guidelines to follow when setting your test:

Should learners be required to write a short essay, the structure of the essay would include an introduction, elaboration/body and conclusion, **based on the specific key concepts** in the question.

DEPTH/SCOPE OF CONTENT

The depth of content refers to the extent to which a topic is focused upon and explored. It helps to enhance the depth of learning as learners develop their content knowledge. It also assists in connecting the relevant content to a learner's real-life experiences.

The following EXAMPLES could be used as a guideline when dealing with the depth of content:

Class discussions on a topic and subtopic such as “**Human factors causing ill-health: Contributing factors: unhealthy sexual behaviour**” would include, e.g.:

1. The **definition** of each key concept, e.g. **ill-health, unsafe sexual behaviour**
2. Discuss **reason** why this type of behaviour is still prevalent among the youth.
3. Assess the **negative** of unsafe sexual behaviour on the life of a young person.

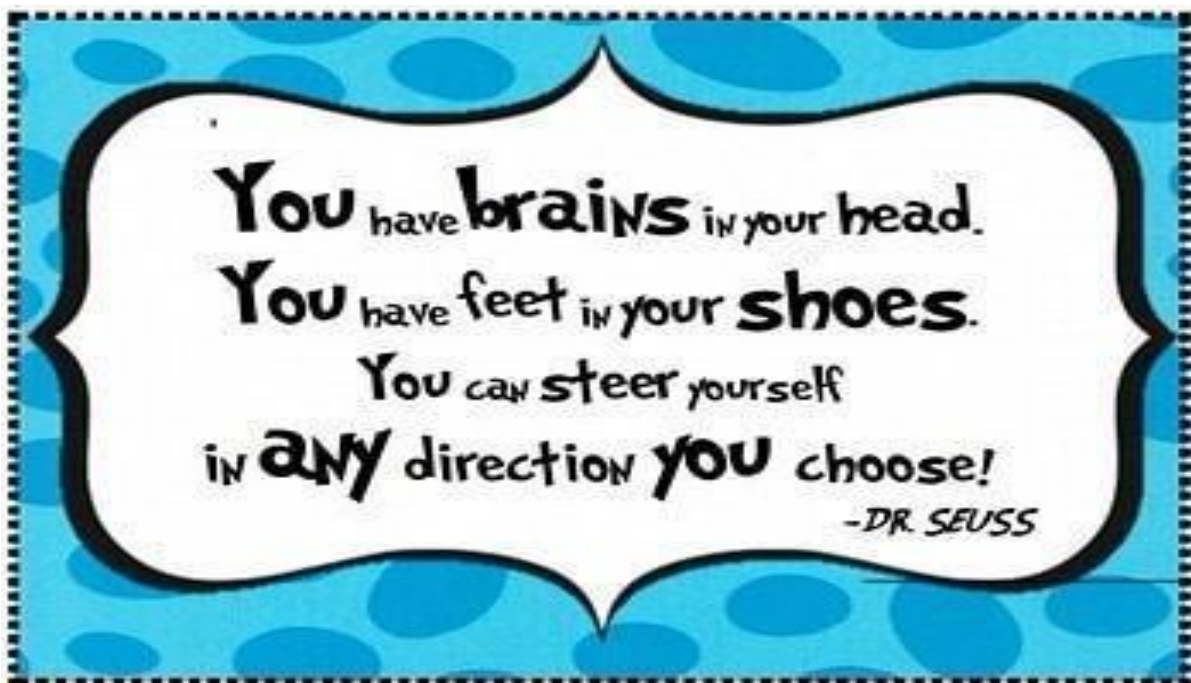

- **FOUR different** exercise programs that promote fitness and give examples of each (4 x 2 marks).

- **Cardiovascular fitness** is when you do a lot of movement-based exercise to burn fat. This includes activities such as running, brisk walking, cycling, rowing, swimming, aerobics, climbing stairs. Strengthens your heart and improves fitness for team sports.
- **Muscular Resistance fitness** is when you focus on building muscle by working against a force rather than burning fat. You can do this by lifting weights, Push-ups, sit-ups, pull-ups and squats. Makes you stronger, gives you more muscle definition eg “six-pack”.
- **Muscular Endurance fitness** is a focus on building stamina by increasing the amount of time we can do an exercise before getting tired. It includes activities such as long-distance running, biathlon or triathlons, hiking, cross-country running. Good for general health and participation in team sports.
- **Flexibility fitness** is a form of exercise that aims to improve suppleness. It is a slower form of exercise that involves bending joints and stretching muscles. Eg Yoga, dancing, gymnastics and martial arts. Good for general health, blood flow and relaxation.

QUESTION 6

Benefits of participating in community work

- The more you help others, the better you feel about yourself (improves self-awareness and boosts self-esteem) leads to be confident about study and career.

- Become more politically and civic aware (register to vote; community development initiatives; active contributor to the greater good; etc.) know what to study to help build SA
- Closes the gap between academic work and the real human needs (provides motivation by connecting theory and practice).
- Psychological benefits: increases positive feeling and mental health; decreases depression and stress.
- Social benefits: increase bond amongst learners and with community; concern and care for others; sense of connectedness of being; embrace diversity.
- Skills development: communication skills; time management; project management; critical thinking and problem solving.

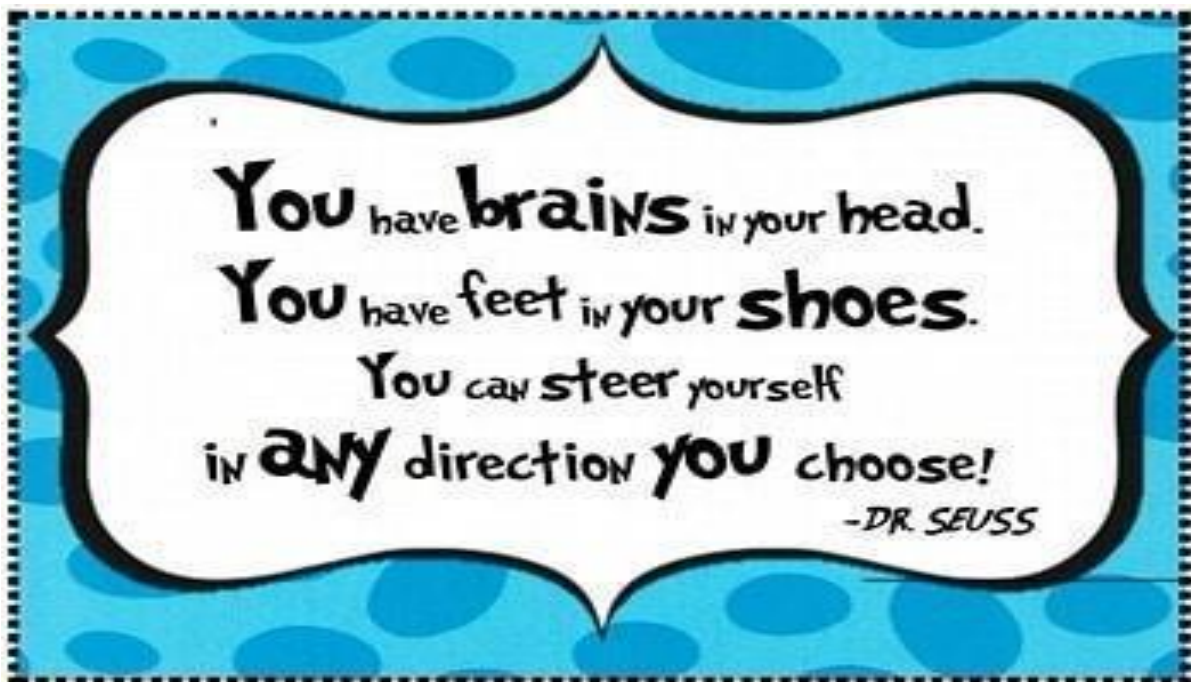

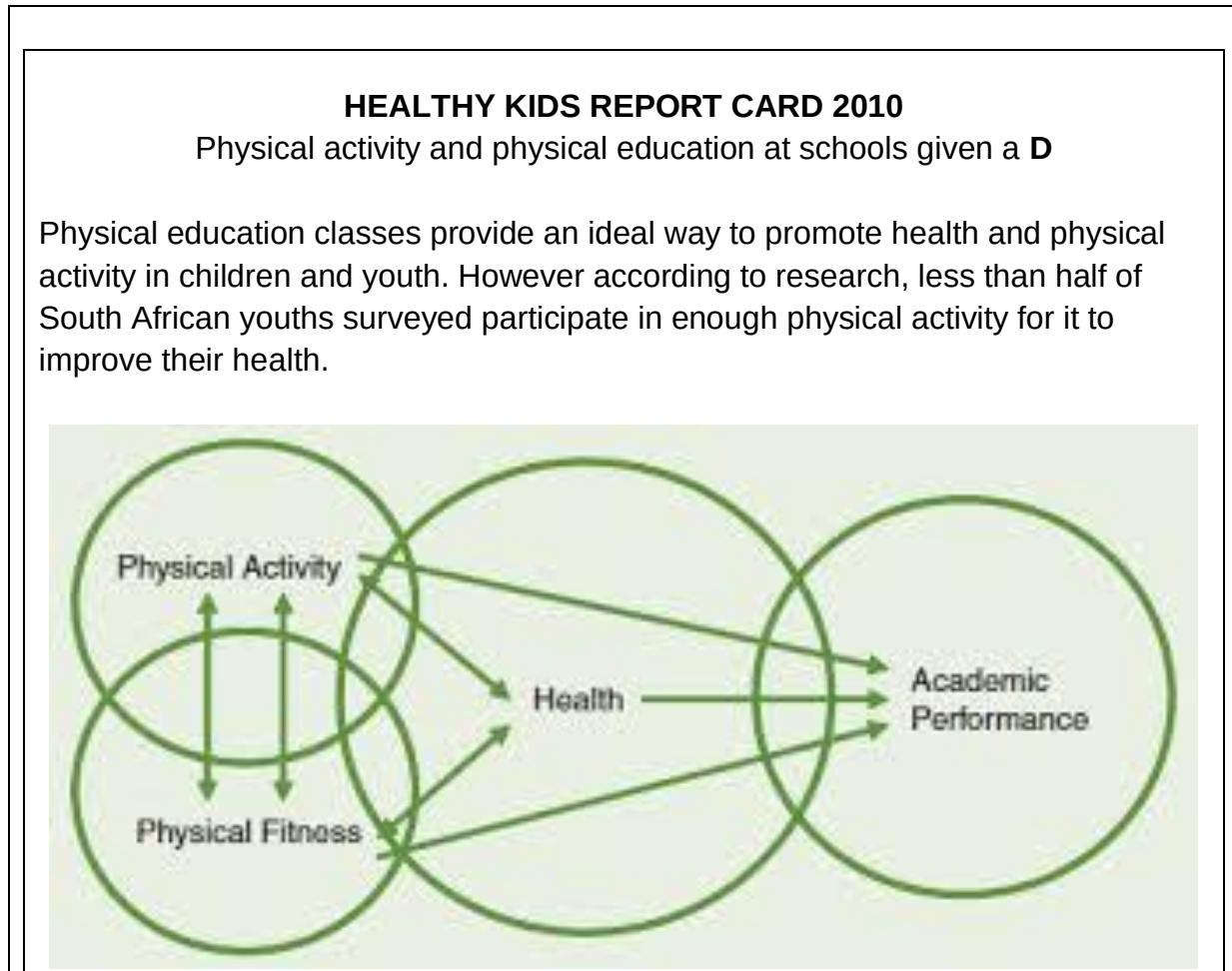

Teen pregnancies hit 99 000 a year

“More than 99 000 schoolgirls fell pregnant in 2013 – a rate of about 271 for every day of that year. This is a dramatic increase from the 81 000 pupils who fell pregnant the previous year and 68 000 in 2011.”

- The period of life when people experience an increase in hormones ✓ and experience many changes associated with becoming an adult ✓ (2)

Explain two factors that may cause teens to make the decision to have sex, even if they are not ready. (2x2=4)

- Poverty / financial problems ✓ might make someone desperate to have sex to make money ✓
- Substance abuse ✓ obstructs judgment and inhibitions and increases libido making it seem okay to have sex in the moment ✓
- Peer pressure ✓ might influence someone to have sex to impress others even if they are not ready ✓
- Low self-esteem ✓ might influence someone to have sex with someone to feel loved/accepted ✓
- The media ✓ might cause false perceptions about sex making it seem casual/acceptable even if one is not ready ✓
- Lack of education/awareness ✓ influences someone to have sex without thinking about whether they are ready without knowing the consequences. ✓

(Any 2 relevant factors (not sexual abuse related factors because the question states that someone MADE the DECISION to have sex))

Analyze how teenage pregnancy might prevent someone from reaching their full potential. (3)

- A teen might decide to drop out of school to get a job to support the child ✓, which may result in her not furthering her education ✓ which may limit her potential ✓
- A teen might become emotionally stressed from having a baby ✓ which may impact her concentration at school and at work ✓ limiting her from achieving her potential ✓
- A teen has many more responsibilities as a mother ✓ which may limit the time for academics ✓ limiting her potential to succeed or develop ✓
- Because of the many more responsibilities as a mother ✓ a teen has less time for extra-mural contributions ✓ which limits her potential in cultural or sporting activities ✓
- Because of her many more responsibilities as mother ✓ a teen has less time for social relationships with friends ✓ which may limit her potential with her social skills ✓

(Any relevant explanation must be insightfully explained – 3marks; good explanation - 2marks but limited explanation=1mark)

Discuss how “self-awareness” and “problem-solving skills” could influence you in making responsible decisions regarding sex. (2x2=4)

- By being self-aware you know what your values are ✓ and can make confident decisions according to what is important to you OR you can set a high standard for yourself and the decisions you make ✓ (2)
- By using problem solving skills you work through all the possible solutions and effects of solutions ✓ choosing the best option for yourself / making the most responsible decision for yourself ✓ (2)

Suggest two strategies the government should implement to reduce the number of teen pregnancies in South Africa. (2)

- Increase awareness of risky sexual behavior through the media / awareness campaigns / billboards / more education initiatives at schools/ improving the way it is taught in schools ✓
- Provide free condoms at schools / public areas ✓
- Ensure sufficient grants are awarded to the poor to prevent economic sex ✓
- Start education programs that include the teaching of values and skills to prevent bad decision-making ✓
- Provide free and easily accessible support systems / counseling to help teens with emotional problems/ low self-esteem to prevent them from engaging in risky sex ✓
